


The California Land Conservation Act (AKA Williamson Act) is a 60-year-old farmland preservation policy designed to prevent urban sprawl and keep farmers farming.

Existing law allows counties to sign contracts with ranchers and growers to keep land in agriculture or open space in exchange for reduced property taxes.

California Legacy Partnership honors the intent of the Land Conservation Act by aligning clean energy goals with land availability demands in the Central Valley:





California Legacy Partnership proposes a streamlined process for faster siting of energy infrastructure on former agricultural parcels in the Central Valley

- \rightarrow Provides relief by unencumbering severely water constrained farmlands
- → Gives farmers alternative economic opportunities
- \rightarrow Extends protections against urban over-expansion
- → Creates well-paying green jobs and sustainable economic development for local communities
- → Moves solar development away from sensitive habitat
