The California Land Conservation Act (AKA Williamson Act) is a 60-year-old farmland preservation policy designed to prevent urban sprawl and keep farmers farming.

Existing law allows counties to sign contracts with ranchers and growers to keep land in agriculture or open space in exchange for reduced property taxes.

California Legacy Partnership honors the intent of the Land Conservation Act by aligning clean energy goals with land availability demands:




